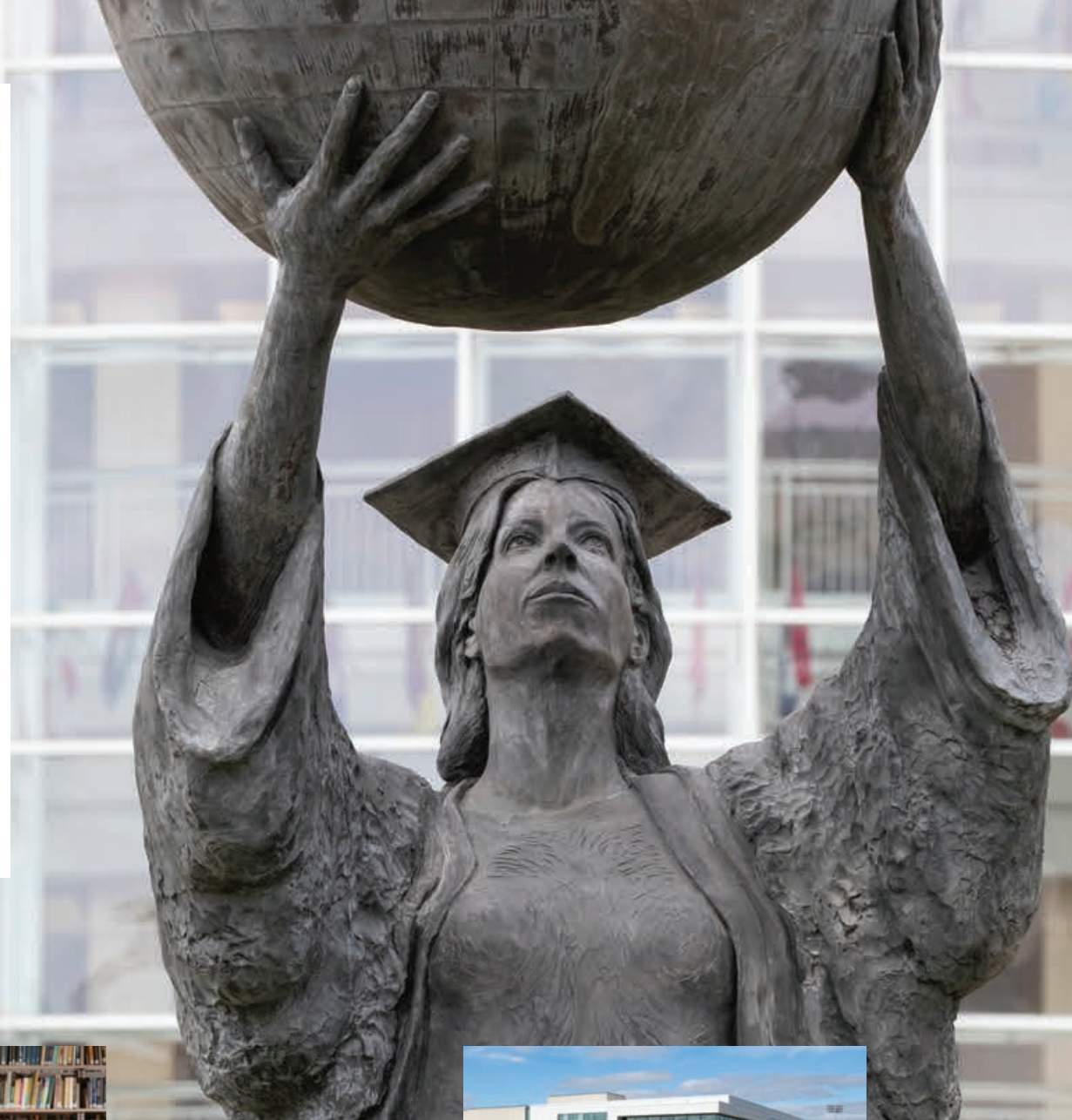

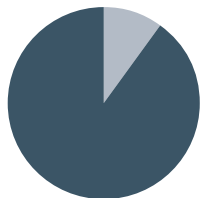

Accounting senior Kamran Choudhry knows the value of a dollar.

He grew up in an immigrant family who built a business from the ground up.

When he came to Missouri State as a first-generation student, his goal was to graduate debt-free.

Because of people like you who support MSU, he will.

LEARNING A LOVE FOR BUSINESS, SEEING A STRUGGLE

Choudhry was born in New York. His parents had emigrated from Pakistan in 1997.

After they moved to the Kansas City area in 2002, his dad owned a few gas stations.

“We’d usually visit him while he was working and see that he was dealing with a lot of management and a lot of money,” Choudhry said. “As a young boy I wanted to help my father, so I’ve always wanted to do something business-related.”

The recession hit in 2008, and his family lost all but one of their businesses.

Choudhry saw his father work hard and drive many miles to regrow his holdings.

“Seeing the dedication toward getting those businesses, and making sure he had money to provide for us, really pushed me forward.”

In 2013, Choudhry’s father passed away. He left the family businesses to Choudhry’s mother.

It took the family six years of struggles to get back on their feet. “It was a hard time financially,”

MSU SCHOLARSHIP LEAVES RESOURCES FOR SIBLINGS

Choudhry, the eldest of six children, is careful with money.

“My mentality has always been that if I draw from a limited pool, there’s less for my other siblings to draw from,” he said. “If you can remove one from the pool and split five ways, there is more for everybody. That drives me every day.”

This drive, along with the goal of graduating debt-free, has pushed Choudhry throughout his education at Missouri State.

He holds the Bernice Gabriel Memorial Scholarship,

as well as another business scholarship. These lower his stress about finances.

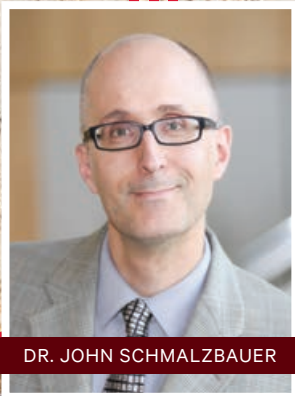
“They allow me to focus less time and energy on how to pay for school.”

Choudhry has used that time and energy to get involved on campus. He is a resident assistant, and has served with the Association of International Students and Student Activities Council.

He credits the generosity of supporters for these experiences.

“If you’ve given to student scholarships, you’ve given a recipient time. This time lets them further their studies, get more involved on campus and essentially have a more fruitful life.”

FACULTY ENDOWMENTS GIVE MISSOURI STATE A PLACE ON THE NATIONAL STAGE



DR. JOHN SCHMALZBAUER

Dr. John Schmalzbauer, a professor of religious studies, is an expert in Protestantism in America and religion on college campuses.

For a recent book, he spent years researching and collaborating with experts from around the nation.

In 2018, he and a co-author published "The Resilience of Religion in Higher Education."

"It's an overview of all the work that's been done on the heightened role of religion in higher education," he said.

The book documents an openness to religion in collegiate communities. It challenges the notion that religion on campuses has declined or disappeared.

Schmalzbauer was able to conduct this notable research because he holds a faculty endowment as the Blanche Gorman Strong Chair in Protestant Studies.

"PEOPLE AROUND THE COUNTRY KNOW ABOUT MSU"

Schmalzbauer first came to Missouri State in 2004.

His endowed position was created thanks to a private donation from a university supporter.

This chair is a special role within his department.

With the extra funding he receives, Schmalzbauer is able to prioritize his research, create projects like his book and pursue global collaborations.

He brings his expertise into the classroom as he teaches and advises students.

"It's been very rewarding to see these scholars in the making," he said.

"People around the country know about MSU's department of religious studies. Our students go to prestigious graduate programs and become part of the field."

THESE GIFTS SHOW "WE'RE A PLACE ON THE MOVE"

Faculty endowments enrich many aspects of university life, Schmalzbauer said.

"They call attention to Missouri State in the landscape of American higher education," Schmalzbauer said.

"They show that we're a place on the move, doing serious hiring in several different areas. They show that MSU allows faculty members to be part of conversations around the country."

Schmalzbauer is thankful his endowed position brought him to the Ozarks 15 years ago.

"I wouldn't have been able to come to this part of the world without it," he said. "It is a privilege to live here. It's so fascinating, complex and diverse."

He encourages potential donors to consider supporting endowments because they benefit future generations.

"It's a way to put tangible resources into an area of study you are passionate about."

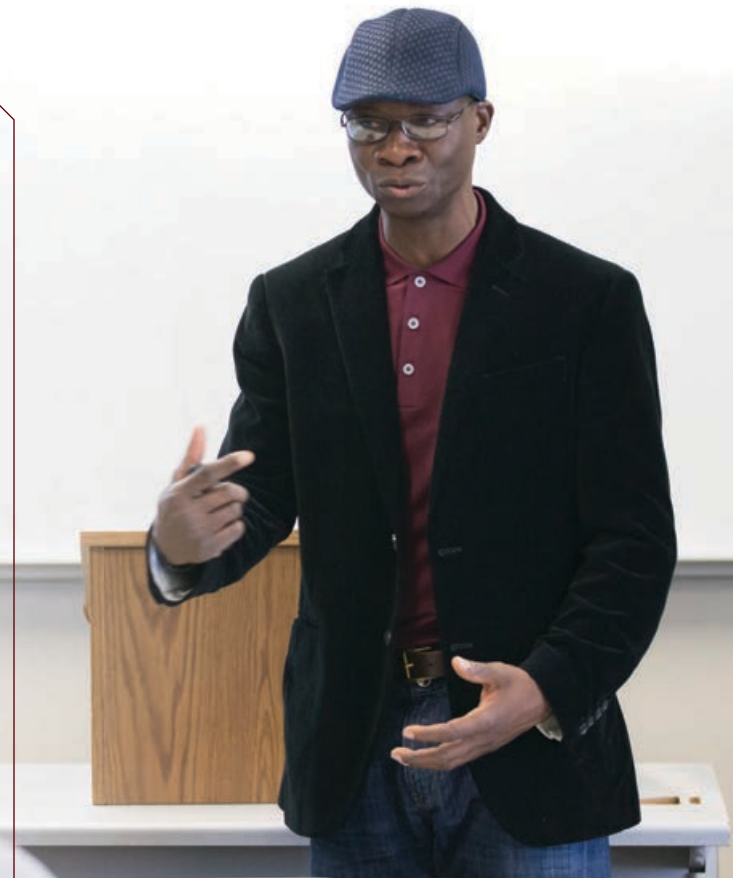

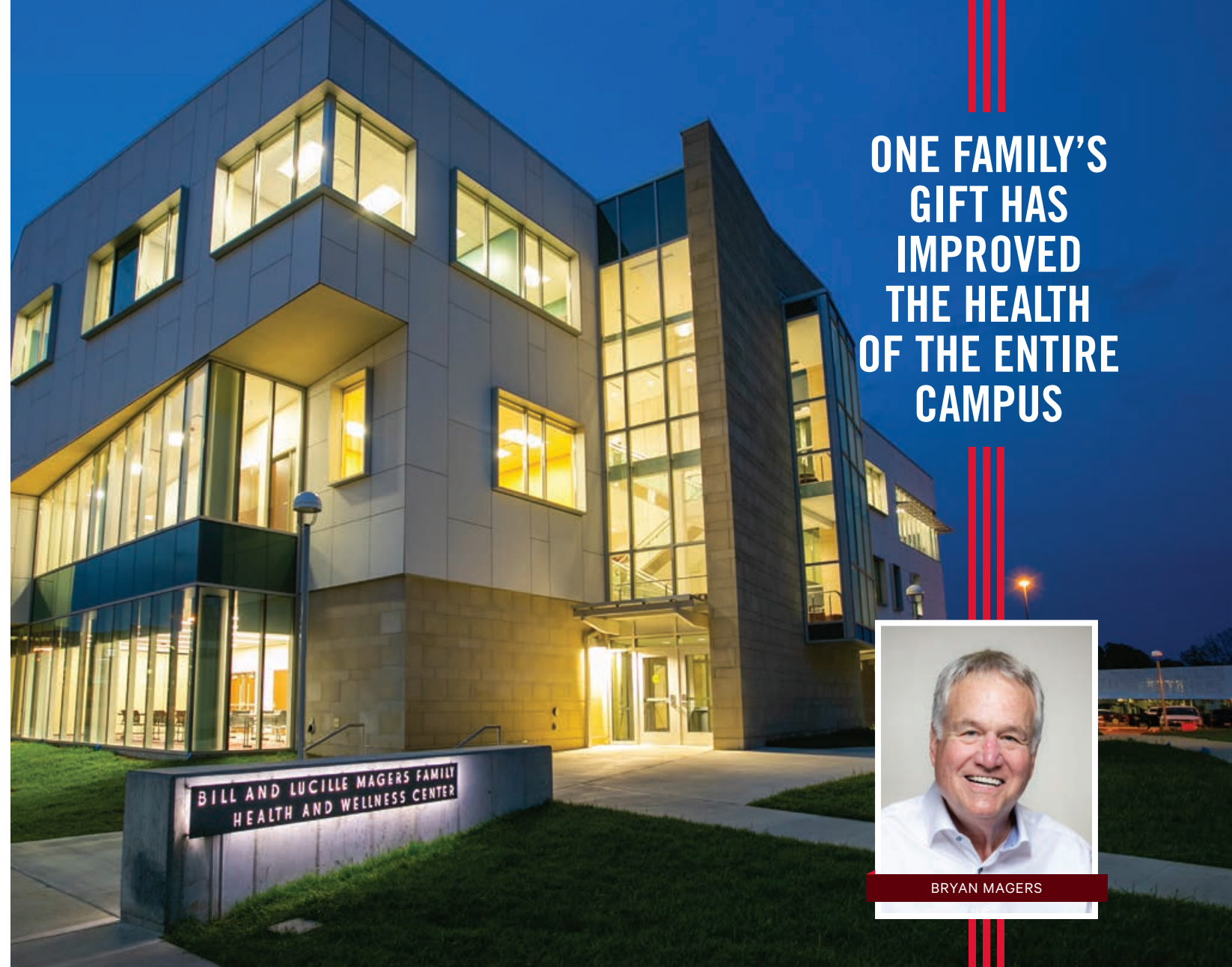

ONE FAMILY’S GIFT HAS IMPROVED THE HEALTH OF THE ENTIRE CAMPUS

In 2014, Missouri State had a problem: A study showed our health and wellness center was on track to quickly outgrow its facility.

That meant soon, the MSU community might not be able to access care in a timely way.

PEOPLE STEPPED UP TO HELP — ESPECIALLY ONE FAMILY

In October 2015, students voted in favor of a fee to pay for a larger center. Gifts and grants came in from supporters.

One family decided to name the center, creating a legacy while helping us build a new medical home for students and employees.

The Bill and Lucille Magers Family Health and Wellness Center was dedicated in 2018.

Brothers Bryan and Randy Magers and their wives, Chris and Ellen, supported the center in honor of the brothers’ late parents, Bill and Lucille.

Bryan Magers was influenced by seeing his parents give their time and resources to their favorite causes.

“They would have wanted to be involved in this,” he said, because of how much the center helps students. “Fewer than 5% of the state universities in this country have a facility like this on campus. That’s just amazing to me.”

UNIQUE CLINIC NOW HAS A HOME IN A “LEGACY BUILDING”

Now, at the Magers Health and Wellness Center, Missouri State students and employees can receive primary care.

Other amenities include a pharmacy, a laboratory, mental health care, radiology (including on-site X-rays) and many other specialized services.

Caitlin Schaefer, who graduated in 2018, was the student body vice president at the time of the building’s dedication. She served as a student leader for MSU orientations, so she heard comments from family members.

“The most common concern:

Will my student be safe, healthy and happy? This building gives that sense of relief that there is a warm, welcoming and convenient resource to get your student back on track,” she said.

Dr. Frederick D. Muegge is Missouri State’s director of health and wellness services. He said the staff at Magers wants to give the highest quality, most convenient care at the lowest possible cost.

“This is a unique clinic, which is now in a legacy building,” he said. “The finest clinical staff in southwest Missouri now has the finest building in which to serve. We will always strive to make you proud of your generous support.”

When the Pride Marching Band is performing, you can guarantee MSU spirit is soaring.

You see this group at major events and athletics contests on campus and across Springfield.

They also raise the national and international profile of MSU when they perform at events like the London New Year's Day Parade.

Many aspects of the Pride Band — uniforms, equipment, the state-of-the-art Wehr Band Hall and even the performers themselves — are possible thanks to your support.

"We wouldn't be able to do

what we do without private funding," said Brad Snow, director of the Pride Band.

"IF WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO PLAY, WE ARE THERE"

The Pride Band, with about 330 members, is one of the most visible organizations at MSU.

"The students do it because they love it," Snow said. "They have so much energy and so many ideas."

This group takes Missouri State's public affairs mission seriously.

"We love community engagement," Snow said. "When people call and ask if we can provide a group to perform at an

event, if we're able to do it, we do it. If we have an opportunity to play, we are there."

SUPPORT GOES TO SCHOLARSHIPS, UNIFORMS AND MORE

In 2017, the band started a crowdfunding campaign for new uniforms.

Through the online campaign and other private donations, the band raised \$110,000 in just six months.

They first donned their new uniforms during the 2018 football season.

But your support goes far beyond making sure the band members look sharp.

"We wouldn't have our

building, including furniture, without the help of donors," Snow said. "We've also been able to award many scholarships to our talented students through the years."

But the best part of private support, Snow said, is that it eases the financial burden for students.

"What we do takes a lot of time. If we can give band students any additional financial assistance so they don't have to take a second job or a loan, that's a big help," he said.

"Private support not only makes a difference to them during their time here. It benefits them for the rest of their lives."
