
USA Today named our Foster Recreation Center in their 2019 list of 51 amazing university and college buildings across the USA.



HIGH SCHOOL CORE-CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

The high school core-curriculum requirement is based on recommendations of the Missouri Coordinating Board for Higher Education.

ENGLISH: Four units of course work emphasizing college preparatory composition, research skills, analysis of literature and other content of comparable or greater rigor. Speech and debate courses may be included.

MATHEMATICS: Three units of course work emphasizing college preparatory algebra and other content of comparable or greater rigor. Students who complete algebra prior to their freshman year must complete three additional units in grades 9-12. Four units of mathematics are recommended.

SOCIAL STUDIES: Three units of course work emphasizing American history, Missouri government and Missouri history as required by state statute (Missouri residents only), geography/world civilizations and other content of comparable or greater rigor.

SCIENCE: Three units emphasizing college preparatory biology, chemistry and other content of comparable or greater rigor. One unit must be a laboratory course.

FINE ARTS: One unit emphasizing visual arts, instrumental or vocal music, dance, theater or other content of comparable or greater rigor. Graduates of accredited Missouri high schools meet this through completion of the fine-arts requirement for graduation.

ACADEMIC ELECTIVES: Three units selected from foreign language and/or a combination of two or more of the areas listed above or computer science.

ADDITIONAL ELECTIVES: Additional elective credit to bring total to 24 units (required of Missouri high school graduates).

ADMISSION TO MISSOURI STATE

Class rank

If you successfully complete the high school core curriculum before graduating from high school, you will qualify for admission if you meet the requirements in the scale below.

How to use this scale

STEP 1: Using your class-rank STEP 2: Follow the line you identified in percentile and grade point average Step 1 across the scale to determine the minimum ACT or SAT score you determine which will place you higher on this scale. For example, if your class must have. 

Undeclared major/default

These are all of the extracurricular interest spreads, including two default ones.

We group their various interests (as listed in the ACT test questionnaire) into four categories:

1. Arts

- 2. Student organizations
- 3. Athletics
- 4. Fraternity/sorority life

We wrote and designed one spread for each category, plus two default ones.



Arts: instrumental music, vocal music, publications/literary, debate, dramatics/theater, radio/TV



Athletics: varsity or intramurals



Student organizations: student government, departmental clubs, religious organizations, political organizations, special interest groups, campus or community service organizations



Greek life: fraternities/sororities

Two default extracurricular interest spreads

When we don't have any information for a student, we use these two default spreads.

When we only know of one interest area for a student, we will use that specific variable spread plus a default one. So, in total, the students will always see two spreads.




Default spread 1: spirit and traditions
